What is flyball?

Flyball is a fast-paced and exciting sport with teams of four dogs that compete in relay races. Each dog jumps over four hurdles, triggers a spring-loaded box, catches a ball, and returns over the hurdles.

Who is participating in the tournament?

The competition will include many of our own Alaska-trained dogs representing a wide variety of breeds and mixes, such as an American Pit Bull Terrier (ranked 13th in North America), a 100-pound St. Bernard/Lab, and a 14-pound Poodle mix. Other competitive out-of-state teams will also be participating, coming from as far away as North Carolina and Saskatchewan, Canada.
