



## Welcome to the 5<sup>th</sup> Annual Alaska Summer Solstice Flyball Tournaments!

Hosted by Alaska Dogs  
Gone Wild

We would like to thank you so much for choosing to participate in our tournaments. For each of our previous summer solstice events, we have had substantial media coverage, which attracted numerous spectators, especially on the weekend. We hope that this year will be no different.

If you are traveling from out of state, we hope that you enjoy your visit to Alaska. Please let us know if you need anything during your stay, or if you have any questions about Alaska. We would also love any constructive criticism on hosting a tournament, training methods, or anything else that may help grow flyball in Alaska.

### Competition-related information

*Dates / location:* We are hosting two separate two-day tournaments on June 23-24 and June 26-27, 2010 at the Alaska State Fairgrounds in Palmer, AK (see the Directions section of this letter). June 25 and June 28 are make-up rain days. However, since we only need to fit in 15 races per tournament day, the rain days will most likely not be necessary.

*Head Judge / Regional Director:* Our head judge will be Curtis Smith. Our acting Regional Director will be Stacy Smith.

*Racing format:* Each tournament has a single division each of Regular and Open class teams with no breakout time. Racing in the Regular class will involve three round robins per day with each race composed of four heats. Racing in the Open class will involve six round robins per day with each race composed of four heats. Each team will run 48 heats/tournament.

*Times:* On the first day of each tournament (Wednesday, June 23 and Saturday, June 26), height dog measuring and box measuring will start at 9:00 AM followed by a meeting at 9:15 AM. Racing will take place at regular intervals between 9:30 AM and 4 PM (see attached schedule).

*Seed chart and racing schedule:* Copies of our approved seed chart and racing schedule are included in this packet. They are also available for download from our tourney website. We will provide each participant with a laminated pocket-sized racing schedule.

*Scoring / awards / placements:* For tournament scoring information, please see a copy of our seed times and racing format file (attached). After each tournament, we will present a special memento and some dog treats for all placements.

*C.2 forms:* We will have printed pre-filled C.2 forms based on the information that each team supplied on their entry forms.

### Venue information

*Rental area:* We have rented the portion of the Alaska State Fairgrounds between the Plaza (represented by a large "i" on the map--see page 5) and the Purple Gate including the restroom next to the Borealis Theater.

*Pools for dogs:* Believe it or not, it can get downright hot in Alaska. So, we will have wading pools available for the dogs to use.

*Locked gate:* If you intend to camp overnight at the tourney site, we are supposed to lock the Purple Gate each night, but we can provide you with the combination. During the day, please dummy lock the gate since our contract with the Alaska State Fairgrounds specifies that spectators are not allowed to drive onto the grounds.

*Alaska State Fairgrounds rules:* Please remain within our rented portion of the grounds (i.e., the Purple Trail area). Please pick up after your dogs. We will provide numerous trash receptacles scattered around the grounds with poop bags nearby. No alcoholic beverages are allowed on the grounds; although policing this particular rule is a different matter altogether.

### Photographer

Jim Haga, ADGW's much revered photographer, will be taking high-resolution photos during the tourneys. Prints and/or digital originals will be available for a small fee with all proceeds donated to ADGW.

## Food

Complimentary coffee/tea will be available on-site throughout each day. There are also several fast food options in both Palmer and Wasilla including a Subway shop and a McDonald's in both towns, along with a Taco Bell and Wendy's in Wasilla. At the end of each racing day, consider dining at one of the numerous restaurants we recommend (see attached list).

## Camping information

Overnight camping and RV parking will be available within our rental area at the tourney site. The fees are \$15/night for RVs and \$10/night for tent camping payable to ADGW. Electrical hookups are available, but there are no sewer or water hookups. Water and restrooms are available on the grounds. See page 6 for information on shower locations and where to find RV dump stations.

## Social/recreational stuff

*Summer Solstice BBQ:* After the first day of racing (Wednesday, June 23), there will be a potluck/BBQ for all the tourney participants and their guests. It will take place at an ADGW member's house on Mirror Lake in Chugiak. Directions will be provided at the tourney site.

*Open to suggestions!:* We are, of course, open to suggestions for other tourney-related social activities for either this year's event or perhaps for future tourneys.

## Directions

Alaska State Fairgrounds (near MP 40 Glenn Hwy)

\* Also look for signs that we'll place on the Glenn Hwy \*

From downtown Palmer:

- 1) Make your way to the Glenn Hwy (Route 1) and head south toward Anchorage. (We will provide a map of Palmer.)
- 2) Turn left onto E. Inner Springer Loop (~0.4 miles south of the Glenn Hwy / S. Colony Way intersection).
- 3) The Purple Gate entrance is across from the Spenard Builders Supply hardware store, which is just past the railroad tracks.

From downtown Anchorage:

- 1) Make your way to the Glenn Hwy (Route 1) and head north toward Eagle River, Wasilla, and Palmer.
- 2) Near Wasilla, continue on the Glenn Hwy by taking the Palmer exit to the right.
- 3) Turn right onto E. Inner Springer Loop at the northern end of the fairgrounds.
- 4) The Purple Gate entrance is across from the Spenard Builders Supply hardware store, which is just past the railroad tracks.

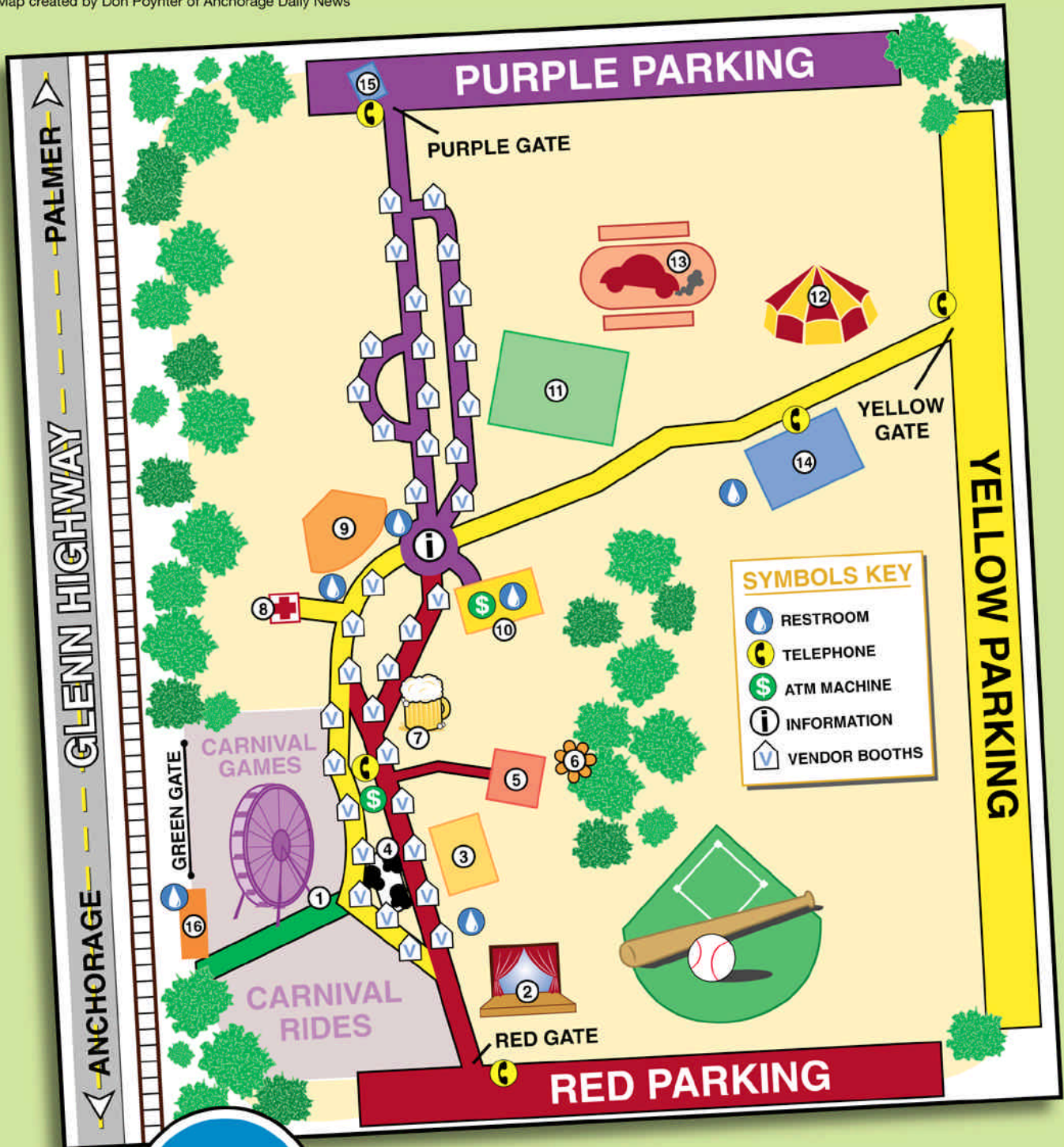

Racing in the Open class will involve six round robins per day with each race composed of four heats. Two tournament points will be awarded for each heat won along with two tournament points for winning the race. One tournament point will be given to each team for tied races. Heats ending in a tie will result in one point awarded to each team. Tournament placements will be determined by summing all accumulated points.
